### REQUEST OF CITIZENS & PUBLIC COMMENT

Realtors' presentation of playset for Bender Park

Carol Hardesty presented a proposal on the behalf of the Eastern Montana Board of Realtors to donate a playset with a value of \$9,700 to Bender Park. She said she had been communicating with Director Gray and Foreman Stone on the project. There will be volunteers from MC 2, Kiwanis and National Association of Realtors to construct the playset and surround it with rubber mulch. Hopefully it will be completed by September 15, 2016.

Kristy Murphy- Zoning Compliance

Kristy Murphy, 200 Hubbel Street, handed out a copy of the noncompliance writ that was given to Todd Schwab January 30, 2015. She said it clearly delineates what he was supposed to do. She said in the letter it clearly specifies that the property is presently in a Mobile Home A area, and allowed two trailer houses. Also, per Dennis Hirsch it is also vacant land and there was no permit. She passed around a picture to show the area that was discussed. She also passed out a picture of the property from this spring, and then from the present. She said trucks come and go all hours of the day, seven days a week. She added that he had not been dumping on it anymore.

She said that she was told by Jeff Noble that the issue would have to go back to the Mayor and charge him again.

President Galbraith apologized that the Mayor was not present and that she would convey the issue to him.

Mrs. Murphy said that it is time to do something about it, because there are many others that received violations and have cleaned up their property.

Councilperson Uden asked Attorney Rice that since he had been served with a violation, can a warrant be issued for his arrest. Attorney Rice said no, it has been through the process, but he would talk to Prosecutor Noble as to what had happened so far. He thought it may have to be reviewed by the Zoning Board again and go from there. He said he would ask Prosecutor Noble to update the Mayor on the issue.

After a long discussion, Councilperson Wilcox suggested to postpone further discussion until more information is available.

### Other

Bernice Cotton, 621 Felton Street, said she was at the meeting for the third time to find out what was happening with the mess on Wells Street. She was aware that Mr. Certain was issuing warrants, but nothing is happening. President Galbraith said the Mayor was absent and did not know where the issue was at, but she would convey the information to the Mayor. Chief Colombik said unfortunately everything is jammed up in court.

Attorney Rice said that it will be six months from the day they first appear in Court. That is the speedy trial rule.

Councilperson Gardner said that he talked to Prosecutor Noble and the attorney representing this individual is drafting a letter for a settlement agreement, so maybe the City can clean up the site. The courts would be willing to let him out to represent himself.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

A. Discussion on Jeff Williams request to refer back to Board of Appeals for preliminary approval on setback

Property Owner Jeff Williams, 1611 Tompy Street, asked Council for approval on a special permit to install raise planters in his boulevard on Cottage Street. The first twenty five feet coming off Tompy Street would have an L shaped bench installed and the remaining 30' along Cottage a raised planter bed which have four perpendicular parts and three parallel parts to Cottage Street. They would be three feet high with plants no higher than three feet tall so not to exceed the six feet limit in the Cities Ordinance. He said he has very limited time and would like to make it look attractive and appealing instead of the weeds.

Attorney Rice explained that the issue was first presented to the Board of Appeals regarding the setback and sent to Council for feedback on the setback. The Board of Appeals cannot approve construction on City property, so the feedback will go back to Board of Appeals and then it will make a final recommendation to Council and then a Resolution for the revocable license would need to be approved by the Council.

Councilperson Andrews and Galbraith said that it cannot block the visual, so it could not be on a corner.

Councilperson Uden asked if Mr. Certain had given him a notice to clean up his yard. Mr. Williams said yes. Councilperson Uden wondered if he hadn't cleaned up his yard yet, how the City can trust him to keep the plant and planters at the six foot height. Mr. Williams said that he wanted to put a barrier to prevent growth on the right of way and he didn't think that it had been 30 days since he received the notice.

Councilperson Wilcox asked why concrete planter instead of railroad ties or something lower and can be disassemble more easily. Mr. Williams said that he can put something mobile, but did not like the look of railroad ties. He would like something that is appealing like in a business park. He added that he would like to do it around the rest of his yard.

President Galbraith said she will send recommendation to the Board of Appeals.

Administrator Muggli explained that for the last couple of years the Historic Preservation Commission had been pushing for an Ordinance to review and request the demolition of a building of historic value. She said they are talking about buildings like the Olive Hotel.

She said that Building Inspector Hirsch and the commission made a compromise on the process, once Inspector Hirsch receives a building permit she will look it over and if it is a historic building she will call the owner and make them aware of cost benefit analysis, market research, and tax credit availability in the downtown district. It would be entirely up to the property owner as to what they do with the property. From the commission perspective they are looking at preserving historic buildings, so if they can step in and save a building, it is worth a try.

Chairperson Galbraith said that she would like the per hour cost charged raised to \$175.00 or go back to the formula that was used in 2009. She felt that when the ambulance is making a County run, the City is missing out on Billings runs, which would bring in a lot more money. Also, when there is a County run, two employees need to be called in and are paid overtime.

After a long discussion the consensus was to study the cost of the ambulance and bring back to Finance Committee at a later date.

- iv. Fund No. 5610 Airport Fund

#### CITY OF MILES CITY HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT REQUEST (ORDINANCE #874)

**<u>DEFINITION:</u>** An income producing activity within a home where there is no sign or display that will indicate from the exterior that the residence is being used in whole or in part for any other purpose than that of a dwelling, nor which required the employment of any person outside the immediate family.

**PROCEDURE:** The City Council shall conditionally approve or disapprove a citizen's request based on all of the following four (4) criteria:

- 1) Community customs;
- 2) Type of occupation and equipment needed;
- 3) Traffic generation;
- 4) Impact on the neighborhood.

The City Council must be petitioned at a regularly scheduled meeting by the petitioner for a Home Occupation permit prior to the establishment of a home occupation.

Fifty-one percent (51%) of the resident property owners within two-hundred fifty (250) feet determined by the City Engineer's Office, must sign a petition stating that they approve of the planned "Home Occupation" activity before a permit will be considered by the City Council.

Upon issuance of this permit, the permittee will pay the minimum commercial rate for sewer and water for as long as the occupation is valid.

FEES: The initial application and processing fee shall be \$25.00 (Non Refundable) which shall include the first year license fee. Thereafter there shall be an annual Home Occupation License fee of \$10.00 per year payable to the City of Miles City which shall be due on the first business day of each calendar year so long as the business continues to operate.
