**Director Gray**- Announced that the Frog Pool will open this Saturday May 26<sup>th</sup>, hours are 10am to 8pm. The Oasis will open June 4<sup>th</sup>, hours are 1pm to 7pm.

*Clerk Pearce*- Reminded the Public Safety Committee that a meeting will need to be scheduled in June to discuss Fireworks.

## **CITY COUNCIL COMMENTS**

### **Dwayne Andrews:**

- Explained that he had been approached by a citizen asking about building a fire/police department complex. He was embarrassed to tell the citizen that he did not know anything about it. Asked that in the future an e-mail is sent out to Council informing them of all situations.
- Asked Director Gray if anything is going forward with Stanley Field.
   Director Gray said that they have asked for the water to be hooked up to water grass that was planted.
- O'Reilly Auto Parts store on Haynes needs to be cleaned up. There is cheatgrass about three feet high. There is a public nuisance ordinance that should be followed.
- Talked to a few citizens that have businesses adjacent to their homes. They have not applied for a home occupancy license because they would be charged for commercial license. Asked if Council could do anything to change that.
- Had several citizens that complimented the City for the clean up after the Bucking Horse Sale.

*John Uden:* Thanked citizens for cleaning up their yards, but more needs attended to. He thought O'Reilly's was covered under a covenant.

**Brant Kassner**: Still a lot of boats, campers and trailers sitting on the streets. Felt it was a simple law to abide by and asked what the City is doing on the issue. Officer Winkley said he has 4-5 open cases on public nuisance. He keeps a spreadsheet as to what and when they are tagged. Sometimes after he tags the vehicle the owner will move it for a couple of days and park it back where it was in the beginning.

## Rick Huber:

- Sees orange stickers all over the City, knows that Officer Winkley is doing his job.
- Asked what is happening with the public service building and if the City could afford the match that is being proposed by CDBG.
- EBA has money available which could possibly be used for the west end water extension. There would be a fifty percent match from the City
- City looked nice for the Bucking Horse Sale
- Asked if a public service announcement could be put in the paper and on the radio to advise citizens that lawn clippings are not suppose to be swept on the streets or left on curbs.

*Ken Gardner:* Has driven the streets with Officer Winkley and felt he documented his work very well.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

- A. Approval on Flood Plain Administrator Raise of \$2.00/hr
- \*\* Councilperson Uden moved to approve the Flood Plain Administrator raise of \$2.00 per hour based on recommendations from the Public Service Director and seconded by Councilperson Erlenbusch.

Councilperson Wilcox explained that Human Resource Committee looked at the request after Director Gray recommended the increase. They looked at the current wage and compared it to the wage survey that the City completed earlier this year for labor negotiations. Because the position was not explicitly defined in the wage survey, the Committee looked for comparable levels of work and what the wage survey indicated would be an appropriate wage for the level of responsibility, years of service, education and authority of its job responsibility. The Finance Committee also agreed that the wage increase would be appropriate.

Councilperson Galbraith felt the decision was made out of merit, and that would not be right or appropriate.

Director Gray explained that union and non-union request for increases are different. Union increases need to be approved by City and their unions. Non- union employees increase request needs to be approved by their Director, Mayor, Human Resource and Finance Committee. As the Director of that position, he recommended a raise. Councilperson Galbraith explained that there was only so much money in General Fund. Director Gray explained that the position is paid out of several funds and the other funds has the money to cover the increase.

Councilperson Huber asked if the position is going to have less responsibility because the title on the spreadsheet states Flood Plain Administrator. Director Gray explained that the Flood Plain Administrator is taking on more responsibility that was already included in the job position. Councilperson Huber wondered why the position wasn't looked at the time of the survey. Councilperson Wilcox said the City completed the new survey with the information available and the City is using it for wage negotiations. The survey showed a \$2 to \$3 increase was appropriate.

Councilperson Andrews liked the idea for an even handed perspective and fairness. Hoped that whatever the survey showed for all non-union positions the City could find a way to afford following the survey because it is objective and a sense of fairness. He added that the City should look at all the increases at the same time.

Councilperson Wilcox added that it enables the City to retain good qualified staff.

Councilperson Gardner said that from what Director Gray said he believed the increase should not be on merit.

Director Gray said to an extent because there was no other flood plain administrator in Class 2 Cities to compare to.

Councilperson Galbraith said that she understood that increases are not based on merit, because everybody is expected to do their job, so it should be based on their responsibility.

Administrator Malenovsky said she followed the policy that was put in place and if anyone else is seeking an increase, then they should submit a request.

Councilperson Erlenbusch explained that Administrator Malenovsky requested an increase last year and the Council wanted to wait until the survey was completed, so it had something to compare to. The survey has been completed and felt it was time for the increase.

Director Gray asked what the definition of merit is because he felt that employees' increases should be based on it. Is merit described as looking at the job performance that shows how you did that year? What is the incentive for that? Every employee needs to build a case and wondered how merit doesn't come into any scenario when it comes to negotiations. Otherwise what are you working for? Are you working to become a better employee every year?

Councilperson Galbraith asked then what is the point of doing a wage survey? Councilperson Wilcox said that it give the City a base for wages.

Councilperson Uden felt merit should play into wage negotiations, but you also have to look at what the job responsibilities are and compare it to similar position to other Cities. It is a package deal, and it is not whether the employees deserve a raise or not. Merit is important, but job positions and wages paid in other Cities for similar jobs are just as important.

## **Finance Committee Meeting**

## May 17, 2018

The Finance Committee met Thursday, May 17, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. in the City Hall Conference room. Present were Committee Chairperson Susanne Galbraith and Committee Members Rick Huber, Dwayne Andrews and Kathy Wilcox.

Also present were: Fire Chief Branden Stevens, Public Works Director Scott Gray, Public Utilities Director Tom Speelmon, Flood Plain Administrator/ AutoCAD/Assistant PWPV Samantha Malenovsky, Lieutenant Detective Dan Baker, 911 Supervisor Lyne Anderson and City Clerk/Recorder Lorrie Pearce.

Committee Chairperson Galbraith called the meeting to order.

## 1. Request of Citizens:

There was an open discussion on the Emergency Services Building as to why it is being looked at and what is being looked at:

- The police department will no longer receive "free rent" from the Veterans Administration and will be evicted in 18-24 months
- Fire Department building has massive amount of damage
- Looked at four properties- 1) Bump out the fire department on the West Side of the building, adding about 60,000 square feet. The street presently there would be shut down 2) Buy 1.84 acres on the east side for approximately \$390,000 3) Buy 1.92 acres for \$500,000 or 4) Buy .5 acres, which everyone felt was not enough land to build on
- SouthEastern Economic Development representative Julie Korkow is in the process of writing a study grant with a 25% match on \$30,000 equaling \$7500
- A bid for the repairs to the Fire Hall was \$270,000, which MMIA states should be approximately \$30,000. MMIA did say that they would put that money towards building new.
- Drug Task Force and Highway Patrol is interested in finding a place to lease since they are also in the same predicament as the Police Department. Montana Parole is also interested in moving, but would have to wait two years
- If the City built up, an elevator is needed
- Would the City consider naming the Emergency Service Building the Lynam Center
- Dispatch would be interested in moving into the Building, but would need double the space available now
- Would like to add a Community Center that would be used for meeting and training for 40-50 people

## 2. Review and Recommendation on Bid for Florence Stacy Fountain

Director Gray explained that one bid was received for the fountain. He felt the bid was very high and that the project should have a design for contractors to bid on. The bid was from a company that is not experienced in building a fountain and there was no plumbing in the bid. He felt that the City needs to step back, hire an engineer and start from there. He thought it would cost approximately \$20,000 to receive specifications on the fountain.

\*\* After a brief discussion, Committee Member Wilcox moved to deny the bid received for the Florence Stacy Fountain, seconded by Chairperson Galbraith. The motion passed 4-0

## 3. Review and Recommendation on Raise for Flood Plain Administrator

Human Resource Chairperson Wilcox said the HR committee recommended a \$2.00 an hour raise. The committee went over the paperwork and the decision was made based on Performance Evaluation, job description it found everything in order, There were no comparable salaries from other cities so the committee based the increase on similar types of requirements of jobs that the City had.

Director Gray explained that 50% of her salary is paid out of General Fund and 50% is split between other funds. After a long discussion, it was decided that the increase would be \$5,500 a year.

- \*\* Committee Member Wilcox moved to recommend to Council raising the salary of the Flood Plain Administrator by \$2.00 an Hour, beginning July 1, 2018, seconded by Committee Member Andrews. The motion passed 4-0
- 4. Review and Recommendation on Resolution No. 4051- A Resolution Approving an Engagement Letter With Jackson Murdo & Grant, P.C. For Certain Legal Services Related to the Custer County Miles City Flood Protection Project
  - \*\* Committee Member Andrews moved to recommend to Council approving a new resolution assigned to the Jackson Murdo & Grant P.C., seconded by Committee Member Huber. Motion passed 4-0

## 5. Review and Recommendation on MidRivers Franchise Contract

\*\* Committee Member Wilcox moved to recommend to Council to approve the Mid Rivers Franchise Contract, seconded by Committee Member Wilcox.

Chairperson Galbraith explained that MidRivers pays the City 5% of the gross revenue from franchise fees.

Clerk Pearce said that the renewal of the contract went to Public Service and Mr. Uden was going to call MidRivers to talk about the renewal of the contract. She asked Chairperson Galbraith if she would talk with Mr. Uden and give her an update. She would rather not want it to go to Council for approval until MidRivers is aware that the contract is coming.

\*\* The motion passed 4-0

WHEREAS, the City of Miles City wishes to amend the budget for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 to increase the budgeted amount in Fund No. 4000-101000 (Capital Improvements Program Fund Cash Reserves), and to transfer the amount of \$75,000 from Fund No. 1000-101000 (General Fund Cash Reserves) to said Capital Improvements Fund;

AND WHEREAS, such amendment of the final budget will result in an overall increase in appropriation authority within such Capital Improvements Fund,

AND WHEREAS the provisions of §7-6-4006 MCA require public hearing upon any budget amendment resulting in an overall change in appropriation authority,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Miles City, Montana as follows:

That the appropriations for the Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 for Fund No. 4000-101000 (Capital Improvements Program Fund Cash Reserves), shall be increased in the amount of \$75,000; and that a budget transfer to said Capital Improvements fund from Fund No. 1000-101000 (General Fund Cash Reserves) in the amount of \$75,000 is hereby authorized.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a public hearing shall be held on the above proposed amendment to the Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2018, at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers at City Hall, Miles City, Montana. The City Clerk shall cause notice of such hearing to be published in the Miles City Star, in accordance with §7-1-4128 MCA, at least 2 times with at least 6 days separating each publication.

## **RESOLUTION NO. 4160**

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE WORK PLAN AND BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019 FOR BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 101, TO INCLUDE AN INCREASE IN BED TAX FROM \$1 TO \$2, AND PROVIDING FOR HEARING THEREON

**WHEREAS**, the City of Miles City by Ordinance 1202 established Business Improvement District No. 101;

**AND WHEREAS,** §7-12-1132 MCA requires the trustees of such business improvement district to annually submit to the City Council of the City of Miles City, for its approval, a work plan and proposed budget for the ensuing fiscal year;

**AND WHEREAS,** on May 14, 2018, the trustees of said District did submit to the City Council their proposed work plan for FY 2018-2019;

AND WHEREAS, the City Council has considered and approves of such work plan and proposed budget, to include the proposed increase in bed tax from \$1 per bed to \$2 per bed, and desires to finally approve the same, following a public hearing as required by §7-12-1132(3) MCA.

## NOW THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILES CITY, MONTANA AS FOLLOWS:

Upon hearing and full consideration, the City Council of the City of Miles City hereby approves the work plan and proposed budget, to include an increase in bed tax from \$1/room to \$2/room, of Business Improvement District No. 101 for FY 2018-2019, attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that pursuant to §7-12-1132(3) MCA, a public hearing shall be held on the above proposed approval on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2018, at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers at City Hall, 17 S. Eighth Street, Miles City, Montana. The City Clerk shall cause notice of such hearing to be published in the Miles City Star, in accordance with §15-10-203 MCA, at least 2 times with at least 6 days separating each publication. Such publication

shall be placed in a portion of the newspaper other than that portion utilized for legal and classified advertisements.

#### Ladies and Gentlemen:

We have been involved in work with City and County officials and the Steering Committee (the "Committee") for the initial stages of the Section 205 USACE study for the proposed flood control project in the Miles City area (the "Project"). By letter dated May 16, 2017, our firm was engaged to assist with the Project. The term of the May 16, 2017 engagement ends on June 30, 2018 and we are proposing the engagement be continued for the next fiscal year. This letter outlines the scope of work that our firm expects to provide to assist with the Project during the 2019 fiscal year.

For the fiscal year 2018-2019, we anticipate our charges will not exceed \$10,000, which will include no more than two on-site meetings with the Committee and City and/or County staff. The work anticipated by us during that fiscal year will be coordination with the Committee on the Section 205 USACE study and, if necessary to complete USACE study requirements, the preliminary descriptions of the various SID financing options necessary for the Project; including spreadsheets for possible assessments.

## **Billing Procedures and Hourly Rates**

This portion of this letter is to describe our basic billing procedures and current fee structure for the work described above. For our work on the above matter, we shall charge our usual hourly rates. Currently, those rates for attorneys in our firm range from \$165 to \$300 per hour. My hourly rate is currently \$225 and will not change during the term of this agreement. Work performed by legal assistants is currently charged at between \$100 and \$130 per hour, depending on the experience of the legal assistant. In addition, we will charge you for all out-of-pocket expenses which we may incur in connection with our performance of such services. Such out-of-pocket expenses will generally include, but are not limited to, travel expenses (mileage at the

federal rate), photocopying (currently 5 cents per page), courier and overnight mail charges, secretarial overtime, litigation expenses such as filing fees or publications fees, expert witness fees, and related expenses.

Each month you will receive a statement from us, containing two parts. The first part will set forth our hours and fees for services rendered. Examples of the kinds of work that may be covered on this portion of the statement might include analysis and drafting of legal documents; legal research; office and telephone conferences with you, other attorneys or consultants working on this matter; and review of correspondence and other relevant documents. The second portion of the statement will include an itemized list of the out-of-pocket expenditures such as those described above. Statements for services will be sent to you monthly, covering services and expenses rendered through the end of the previous month. Such monthly bills are payable within ten days of receipt. Amounts not paid within 90 days of original invoice will be charged interest at the rate of 10% per annum.

We will send our bills to the City of Miles City and anticipate that the City will then pay 70% and Custer County will pay 30% as described in the Letter Agreement between them dated December 27, 2016.

#### Communication

Our firm has the capacity to communicate with clients via electronic mail (e-mail). We will be happy to communicate with you by e-mail. However, because of the possible deletion of incoming e-mail by our "Spam" monitoring software, we request that if any e-mail communication is critical, you should contact us by telephone to alert us of the impending delivery of the e-mail.

#### **Potential Conflicts**

We represent various financial institutions and businesses with which you may have contractual arrangements. If a conflict should arise between you and one of our other clients, Montana Rules of Professional Conduct require that unless we obtain written consent from both parties, we are unable to represent either party. If this occurs, we will contact you immediately to discuss possible options.

## Right to Terminate Services

You have the right to terminate our services at any time by notifying us in writing. We reserve the same right, but will only do so if: (a) you refuse to cooperate with us; (b) you do not pay our monthly statements in a timely manner; (c) continued representation of you would violate the rules of professional responsibility; or (d) we are unable to adequately perform the work for you because of distance or staff unavailability.

## **ORDINANCE NO. 1326**

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A CABLE TELEVISION FRANCHISE TO CABLE & COMMUNICATIONS CORPORATION, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF

**WHEREAS** the City of Miles City, has determined that the financial, legal and technical ability of Cable & Communications Corporation, a Montana corporation, doing business as Mid-Rivers Cable Television, is reasonably sufficient to provide services, facilities and equipment necessary to meet the future cable-related needs of the community

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Miles City, Montana as follows:

## **SECTION I Definition of Terms**

- 1.1 <u>Terms</u>: For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words and abbreviations shall have the meanings ascribed to them below. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future tense, words in the plural include the singular number and words in the singular number include the plural number:
- A. "Affiliate" means an entity which owns or controls, is owned or controlled by or is under common ownership with Grantee.
- B. "Basic Cable" is the tier of service regularly provided to all subscribers that includes the retransmission of local broadcast television signals.
  - C. "Cable Act" means the Cable Communications Policy Act of 1984, as amended.
- D. "Cable Service" means (i) the one-way transmission to subscribers of video programming or other programming service, and (ii) subscriber interaction, if any, which is required for the selection of such Video Programming or any other lawful communication service.
- E. "Cable System" means a facility, consisting of a set of closed transmission paths and associated signal generation, reception and control equipment or other communications equipment that is designed to provide Cable Service and other service to subscribers.
- F. "FCC" means Federal Communications Commission or successor governmental entity thereto.
- G. "Franchise" shall mean the initial authorization, or renewal thereof, issued by the Franchising Authority, whether such authorization is designated as a franchise, permit, license, resolution, contract, certificate, or otherwise, which authorizes construction and operation of

the Cable System for the purpose of offering Cable Service or other service to Subscribers.

- H. "Franchising Authority" means the City of Miles City or the lawful successor, transferee, or assignee thereof.
- I. "Grantee" means Cable & Communications Corporation, a Montana corporation, doing business as Mid-Rivers Cable Television, or the lawful successor, transferee, or assignee thereof.
- J. "Gross Revenues" mean the monthly Basic Cable Service revenues received by Grantee from Subscribers of the Cable System plus all other revenues received directly, or indirectly, from the operation of the cable system, including, but not limited to, installation and reconnection fees, premium pay services, converter rentals, additional outlet charges, program guides, and local advertising imposed directly or indirectly on any Subscriber thereof by any governmental unit or agency, and which are collected by the Grantee on behalf of such governmental unit or agency.
- K. "Person" means an individual, partnership, association, joint stock company, trust, corporation, or governmental entity.
- L. "Public Way" shall mean the surface of, and the space above and below, any public street, highway, freeway, bridge, land path, alley, court, boulevard, sidewalk, parkway, way, lane, public way, drive, circle or other public right-of-way, including, but not limited to, public utility easements, dedicated utility strips, or rights-of-way dedicated for compatible uses and any temporary or permanent fixtures or improvements located thereon now or hereafter held by the Franchising Authority in the Service Area which shall entitle the Franchising Authority and the Grantee to the use thereof for the purpose of installing, operating, repairing and maintaining the Cable System. Public Way shall also mean any easement now or hereafter held by the Franchising Authority within the Service Area for the purpose of public travel or for utility or public service use dedicated for compatible uses, and shall include other easements or rights-of-way as shall within their proper use and meaning entitle the Franchising Authority and the Grantee to the use thereof for the purposes of installing or transmitting Grantee=s Cable Service or other service over poles, wires, cables, conductors, ducts, conduits, vaults, manholes, amplifiers, appliances, attachments and other property as may be ordinarily necessary and pertinent to the Cable System.
- M. "Service Area" means the present municipal boundaries of the Franchising Authority, and shall include any additions thereto by annexation or other legal means.
- N. "Service Tier" means a category of Cable Service or other services, provided by Grantee and for which a separate charge is made by Grantee.
- O. "Subscriber" means a person or user of the Cable System who lawfully receives Cable Services or other service therefrom with Grantee=s express permission.

P. "Video Programming" means programming provided by, or generally considered comparable to programming provided by a television broadcast station.

## **SECTION 2 Grant of Franchise**

- **2.1** Grant: The City hereby grants to Grantee a nonexclusive Franchise which authorizes the Grantee to construct and operate a Cable System and offer Cable Service and other services in, along, among, upon, across, above, over, under or in any manner connected with Public Ways with the Service Area and for that purpose to erect, install, construct, repair, replace, reconstruct, maintain, or retain in, or over, under, upon, across, or along wires, cables, conductors, ducts, conduits, vaults, manholes, pedestals, amplifiers, appliances, attachments and other related property or equipment as may be necessary or appurtenant to the Cable System.
- **2.2** Term: The Franchise granted pursuant to this Ordinance shall be for an initial fifteen (15) years from the effective date of the Franchise as set forth in Section 2.3, unless otherwise lawfully terminated in accordance with the terms of this Ordinance.
- **2.3** Acceptance; Effective Date: Grantee shall accept the Franchise granted pursuant hereto by signing this Ordinance and filing same with the City Clerk or other appropriate official or agency of the Franchising Authority within sixty (60) days after the passage and final adoption of this Ordinance. Subject to the acceptance by Grantee, the effective date of this Ordinance shall be the sixtieth day after its passage and final adoption.
- **2.4 Favored Nations:** In the event the Franchising Authority enters into a franchise, permit, license, authorization or other agreement of any kind with any other person or entity other than Grantee to enter into the Franchising Authority's streets and public ways for the purpose of constructing or operating a cable system or providing cable service to any part of the Service Area, the material provisions thereof shall be reasonably comparable to those contained herein, in order that one operator not be granted an unfair competitive advantage over another, and to provide all parties equal protection under the law.

## SECTION 3 Standards of Service

- 3.1 <u>Conditions of Street Occupancy</u>: All transmission and distribution structures, poles, other lines and equipment installed or erected by the Grantee pursuant to the terms hereof shall be located so as to cause a minimum of interference with the proper use of Public ways and with the rights and reasonable convenience of property owners who own property that adjoins any of said Public Ways.
- **3.2** <u>Restoration of Public Ways</u>: If, during the course of Grantee=s construction, operation or maintenance of the Cable System, there occurs a disturbance of any Public Way by Grantee, it shall,

at its expense, replace and restore such Public Way to a condition reasonably comparable to the condition of the Public Way existing immediately prior to such disturbance.

- 3.3 Relocation at Request of Franchising Authority: Upon its receipt of reasonable advance notice, not to be less than five (5) business days, the Grantee shall, at its own expense, protect, support, temporarily disconnect, relocate in the Public Way or remove from the Public Way, any property of Grantee when lawfully required by Franchising Authority by reason of traffic conditions, public safety, street abandonment, freeway and street construction, change or establishment of street grade, installation of sewers, drains, gas or water pipes, or any other type of structures or improvements by the Franchising Authority; but, the Grantee shall in all cases have the right of abandonment of its property. If public funds are available to any company using such street, easement or right-of-way for the purpose of defraying the cost of any of the foregoing, such funds shall also be made available to the Grantee.
- **3.4** Relocation at Request of Third Party: The Grantee shall, on the request of any person holding a building moving permit issued by the Franchising Authority, temporarily raise or lower its wires to permit the moving of such building, provided: (a) the expense of such temporary raising or lowering of wires is paid by said person, including, if required by the Grantee, making such payment in advance; and (b) the Grantee is given not less than ten (10) business days advance written notice to arrange for such temporary wire changes.
- 3.5 <u>Trimming of Trees and Shrubbery:</u> The Grantee shall have the authority to trim trees or other natural growth overhanging any of its Cable System in the Service Area so as to prevent branches from coming in contact with the Grantee's wires, cables or other equipment. Grantee shall be permitted to charge persons who own, or are responsible for, such trees or natural growth for the cost of such trimming, provided that similar changes are assessed by and paid the utilities or the Franchising Authority for tree trimming. The Grantee shall reasonably compensate the Franchising Authority for any damages caused by such trimming in public right-of-way, or shall, at its own cost and expense, reasonably replace all trees or shrubs damaged as a result of any construction or operation of the system undertaken by Grantee.
- **3.6** <u>Safety Requirements</u>: Construction, installation and maintenance of the Cable System shall be performed in an orderly and workmanlike manner. All such work shall be performed in substantial accordance with applicable FCC or other federal, state and local regulations. The Cable System shall not unreasonably endanger or interfere with the safety of persons or property in the Service Area.
- 3.8 Aerial and Underground Construction: In those areas of the Service Area where all of the transmission or distribution facilities of the respective public utilities providing telephone communications and electric services are underground, the Grantee likewise shall construct, operate and maintain all of its transmission and distribution facilities underground; provided that such facilities are actually capable of receiving Grantee's cable and other equipment without technical degradation of the Cable System's signal quality. In those areas of the Service Area where the transmission or distribution facilities of the respective public utilities providing telephone communications and electric

services are both aerial and underground, Grantee shall have the sole discretion to construct, operate and maintain all of its transmission and distribution facilities or any part thereof, aerially or underground. Nothing contained in this Section 3.8 shall require Grantee to construct, operate and maintain underground any ground-mounted appurtenances such as subscriber taps, line extenders, system passive devices (splitters, directional couplers), amplifiers, power supplies, pedestals, or other related equipment. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Section 3.8, in the event that all of the transmission or distribution facilities of the respective public utilities providing telephone communications and electric services are placed underground after the effective date of this Ordinance, Grantee shall only be required to construct, operate and maintain all of its transmission and distribution facilities underground if it is given reasonable notice and access to the public utilities=facilities at the time that such are placed underground.

Grantee shall keep complete plats and records accurately indicating the sites of its facilities and systems situated within the public ways of the Franchising Authority and keep a copy of said plat thereof on file with the Franchising Authority.

- 3.9 Required Extensions of Service: The Cable System, as constructed as of the date of the passage and final adoption of this Ordinance, substantially complies with the material provisions hereof. Grantee is hereby authorized to extend the Cable System as necessary, as desirable or as required pursuant to the terms hereof within the Service Area. Whenever Grantee shall receive a request for service from at least eight (8) Subscribers within 1320 cable-bearing strand feet (one-quarter cable mile) of its trunk or distribution cable, it shall extend its Cable System to such Subscribers at no cost to said Subscribers for system extension, other than the usual connection fees for all Subscribers; provided that such extension is technically feasible and if it will not adversely affect the operation, financial condition or market development of the Cable System, or as provided for under Section 3.10 of this Ordinance.
- 3.10 Subscriber Charges for Extensions of Service: No Subscriber shall be refused service arbitrarily. However, for unusual circumstances, such as a Subscriber's request to locate his cable drop underground, existence of more than one hundred fifty (150) feet of distance from distribution cable to connection of service to Subscribers, or a density of less than eight (8) Subscribers per 1320 cable-bearing strand feet of trunk or distribution cable, Cable Service or other service may be made available on the basis of a capital contribution in aid of construction, including cost of material, labor and easements. For the purpose of determining the amount of capital contribution in aid of construction to be borne by Grantee and Subscribers in the area in which Cable Service may be expanded, Grantee will contribute an amount equal to the construction and other costs per mile, multiplied by a fraction whose numerator equals the actual number of potential Subscribers per 1320 cable-hearing strand feet of its trunks or distribution cable and whose denominator equals eight (8) Subscribers. Potential Subscribers will bear the remainder of the construction and other costs on a pro rata basis. Grantee may require that the payment of the capital construction in aid of construction borne by such potential Subscribers be paid in advance.
- **3.11 Service to Public Buildings:** The Grantee shall provide without charge one (1) outlet of the most commonly received level of service, not to include Premium Channels, to the Franchising

Authority's office building(s), fire station(s), police station(s) and public school building(s) that are passed by its Cable System. The outlets of Cable Service shall not be used to distribute or sell Cable Services in or throughout such buildings; nor shall such outlets be located in common public areas open to the public. Users of such outlets shall hold Grantee harmless from any and all liability or claims arising out of their use of such outlets, including, but not limited to, those arising from copyright liability. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary set forth in this Section 3.11, the Grantee shall not be required to provide an outlet to such buildings where the drop line from the feeder cable to said buildings or premises exceeds one hundred fifty (150) cable feet, unless it is technically feasible and the appropriate governmental entity agrees to pay the incremental cost of such drop line in excess of 150 cable feet. In the event that additional outlets of Cable Service are provided to such buildings, the building owner shall pay the usual installation fees associate therewith, including, but not limited to, labor and materials. Upon request of Grantee, the building owner may also be required to pay the service fees associated with the provision of Cable Service and the additional outlets thereto.

- **3.12** Emergency Override: In the case of any emergency or disaster, the Grantee shall, upon request of the Franchising Authority, make available its facilities for the Franchising Authority to provide emergency information and instructions during the emergency or disaster period. The Franchising Authority shall hold the Grantee, its agents, employees, officers and assigns hereunder, harmless from any claims arising out of the emergency use of its facilities by the Franchising Authority, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees and costs.
- **3.13** <u>Customer Service</u>: Grantee shall provide its customers toll free telephone access to its office or representatives. Additionally, Grantee agrees to use its best efforts to respond to customer's service complaints by 5:00pm the following business day. Nothing contained herein shall be interpreted to contradict those provisions set forth in Section 7.5.

## SECTION 4 Regulation by Franchise Authority

#### 4.1 Franchise Fee:

A. Fee: Grantee shall pay to the Franchising Authority a franchise fee equal to five (5) percent of Gross Revenues (as defined in Section 1.1 of this Franchise) received by Grantee from the operation of the Cable System on a quarterly basis; provided, however; (i) the term franchise fee includes any tax, fee or assessment of any kind imposed by Franchising Authority or other governmental entity on a cable operator or cable subscriber, or both, solely because of their status as such; (ii) the term franchise fee does not includes any tax, fee or assessment of general applicability (including any such tax, fee or assessment imposed on both utilities and cable operators or their services but not including a tax, fee or assessment which is unduly discriminatory against cable operators or cable subscribers). For the purpose of this Section, the 12-month period applicable under the Franchise for the computation of the franchise fee shall be a calendar year, unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the Franchising Authority and Grantee. The franchise fee payment shall be due and payable thirty (30) days after the close of the preceding quarter. Each payment shall be accompanied by a brief report from a representative of Grantee showing the basis for the computation. In no event, shall the

franchise fee payments required to be paid by Grantee exceed five (5) percent of Gross Revenues received by Grantee in any 12-month period.

- B. <u>Limitation on Franchise Fee Actions</u>: The period of limitation for recovery of any franchise fee payable hereunder shall be five (5) years from the date on which payment by Grantee is due. Unless within five (5) years from and after said payment due date the Franchising Authority initiates a lawsuit for recovery of such franchise fees in a court of competent jurisdiction, such recover shall be barred and the Franchising Authority shall be stopped from asserting any claims whatsoever against the Grantee relating to any such alleged deficiencies within said five (5) years. However, no acceptance of any franchise fee payment by the Franchising Authority shall be construed as a release, waiver or as an accord and satisfaction of any claim the Franchising Authority may have for further or additional sums payable under this Franchise.
- **4.2** Rates and Charges: The Franchising Authority may not regulate the rates for the provision of Cable Service and other services, including, but not limited to, ancillary charges relating thereto, except as authorized pursuant to federal and state law including, but not limited to, the Cable Act and FCC Rules and Regulations relating thereto. Notice of any proposed rate increases shall be filed with the Franchising Authority at least 30 days in advance of the proposed effective date of any such increase.

In the event that Basic Cable Service rate increases are subject to approval of the Franchising Authority, the Grantee may, at its discretion and without consent of the Franchising Authority, increase rates relating to the provision of Basic Service by an amount which is equal to five (5) percent per year or such lesser amount to comply with applicable federal and state law.

4.3 Renewal of Franchise: The Franchising Authority and the Grantee agree that any proceedings undertaken by the Franchising Authority that relate to the renewal of the Grantee's Franchise shall be governed by and comply with the provisions of Section 626 of the Cable Act (as such existed as of the effective date of the Cable Act), unless the procedures and substantive protections set forth therein shall be deemed to be preempted and superseded by the provisions of any subsequent provision of federal or state law.

In addition to the procedures set forth in said Section 626(a), the Franchising Authority agrees to notify Grantee of its preliminary assessments regarding the identify of future cable-related community needs and interests, as well as, the past performance of Grantee under the then current Franchise term. The Franchising Authority further agrees that such preliminary assessment shall be provided to the Grantee prior to the time that the four (4) month period referred to in Subsection (c) of Section 626 is considered to begin. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary set forth in this Section 4.3, the Grantee and Franchising Authority agree that at any time during the term of the then current Franchise, while affording the public appropriate notice and opportunity to comment, the Franchising Authority and Grantee may agree to undertake and finalize negotiations regarding renewal of the then current Franchise and the Franchising Authority may grant a renewal thereof. The Grantee and the Franchising Authority consider the terms set forth in this Section to be consistent with the express

provisions of Section 626 of the Cable Act. A reproduction of Section 626 of the Cable Act as such existed as of the effective date of the Cable Act is attached hereto as Schedule 1 and incorporated herein by this reference.

- **4.4** Condition of Sale: Subject to applicable federal, state and local law, if a renewal of Grantee's Franchise is denied and the Franchising Authority either lawfully acquires ownership of the Cable System or effects the transfer of ownership of the Cable System to another person, any such acquisition or transfer shall be at a fair market value, determined on the basis of the Cable System valued as a going concern but with no value allocated to the Franchise itself, or if the Franchise is lawfully revoked for cause and the Franchising Authority acquires ownership of the Cable System or effects the transfer of ownership of the Cable System to another person, any such acquisition or transfer shall be at an equitable price.
- **4.5** <u>Transfer of Franchise</u>: Grantee's right, title or interest in the Franchise shall not be sold, transferred, assigned or otherwise encumbered, other than to an Affiliate, without the prior consent of the Franchising Authority, such consent not to be unreasonably withheld. No such consent shall be required, however, for the transfer in trust, by mortgage, by other hypothecation or by assignment of any rights, title or interest on Grantee in the Franchise or Cable System in order to secure indebtedness.

## SECTION 5 Compliance and Monitoring

- 5.1 Testing for Compliance: The Franchising Authority may perform technical tests of the Cable System during reasonable times and in a manner which does not unreasonably interfere with the normal business operation of the Grantee or the Cable System in order to determine whether or not the Grantee is in compliance with the terms hereof and applicable state or federal laws. Except in emergency circumstances, such tests may be undertaken only after giving Grantee reasonable notice thereof, not to be less than two (2) business days, and providing a representative of Grantee an opportunity to be present during such tests. In the event that such testing demonstrates that the Grantee has substantially failed to comply with a material requirement hereof, the reasonable costs of such tests shall be borne by the Grantee. In the event that such testing demonstrates that Grantee has substantially complied with such material provisions hereof, the cost of such testing shall be borne by the Franchising Authority. Except in emergency circumstances, the Franchising Authority agrees that such testing shall be undertaken no more than two (2) times a year in the aggregate and that the results thereof shall be made available to the Grantee upon Grantee's request.
- 5.2 <u>Books and Records</u>: The Grantee agrees that the Franchising Authority may review such of its books and records, during normal business hours and on a non-disruptive basis, as is reasonably necessary to monitor compliance with the terms hereof. Such records shall include, but shall not be limited to, any public records required to be kept by the Grantee pursuant to the rules and regulations of the FCC. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary set forth herein, Grantee shall not be required to disclose information which it reasonable deems to be proprietary or confidential in nature. The Franchising Authority agrees to treat any information disclosed by Grantee to it as confidential and only to disclose it to employees, representatives and agents thereof that have a need to

know or in order to enforce the provisions hereof.

# SECTION 6 <u>Insurance, Indemnification and</u> <u>Bonds or Other Surety</u>

- **6.1** <u>Insurance Requirements:</u> Grantee shall maintain in full force and effect, at its own cost and expense, during the term of the Franchise, Comprehensive General Liability Insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage. Said insurance shall designate the Franchising Authority as an additional insured. Such insurance shall be non-cancelable except upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the Franchising Authority. Grantee agrees to provide the Franchising Authority with a Certificate of Insurance@ listing the Franchising Authority as an additional insured party.
- **6.2** <u>Indemnification</u>: The Grantee agrees to indemnify, save and hold harmless and defend the Franchising Authority, its officers, boards, agents and employees from and against any liability for damages and for any liability or claims resulting from property damage or bodily injury (including accidental death), which arise out of the Grantee's construction, operation or maintenance of its Cable System, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees and costs.
- 6.3 Bonds and Other Surety: Except as expressly provided herein, Grantee shall not be required to obtain or maintain bonds or other surety as a condition of being awarded the Franchise or continuing its existence. The Franchising Authority acknowledges that the legal, financial and technical qualifications of Grantee are sufficient to afford compliance with the terms of the Franchise and the enforcement thereof. Grantee and Franchising Authority recognize that the costs associated with bonds and other surety may ultimately be borne by the Subscribers in the form of increased rates for Cable Services. In order to minimize such costs, the Franchising Authority agrees to require bonds and other surety only in such amounts and during such times as there is a reasonably demonstrated need therefore. The Franchising Authority agrees that in no event, however, shall it require a bond or other related surety in an aggregate amount greater than \$10,000, conditioned upon the substantial performance of the material terms, covenants and conditions of the Franchise. Initially, no bond or other surety will be required. In the event that one is required in the future, the Franchising Authority agrees to give Grantee at least sixty (60) days prior written notice thereof stating the exact reason for the requirement. Such reason must demonstrate a change in the Grantee=s legal, financial or technical qualifications which would materially prohibit or impair its ability to comply with the terms of the Franchise or afford compliance therewith. If a bond is required, Grantee may provide other surety of guarantee reasonably acceptable to the Franchising Authority in lieu of bond.

## SECTION 7 Enforcement and Termination of Franchise

**7.1 Notice of Violation:** In the event the Franchising Authority believes that the Grantee has not complied with the terms of the Franchise, it shall notify Grantee in writing of the exact nature of the alleged noncompliance or default. Further, if the Franchising Authority believes that Grantee has

become insolvent or is in bankruptcy, (also events of defaults), the Franchising Authority shall give written notice thereof to Grantee.

- 7.2 Grantee's Right to Cure and Respond: Grantee shall have thirty (30) days from receipt of the notice described in Section 7.1; (a) to respond to the Franchising Authority contesting the assertion of noncompliance, or (b) to cure such default, or (c) in the event that, by the nature of default, such default cannot be cured within the thirty (30) day period, initiate reasonable steps to remedy such default and notify the Franchising Authority of the steps being taken and the projected date that they will be completed.
- 7.3 <u>Public Hearing</u>: In the event that Grantee fails to respond to the notice described in Section 7.1 pursuant to the procedures set forth in Section 7.2, or in the event that the alleged default is not remedied within sixty (60) days after the Grantee is notified of the alleged default pursuant to Section 7.1, the Franchising Authority shall schedule a public meeting to investigate the default. Such public meeting shall be held at the next regularly scheduling meeting of the Franchising Authority which is scheduled at a time which is no less than give (5) business days therefrom. The Franchising Authority shall notify the Grantee of the time and place of such meeting and provide the Grantee with an opportunity to be heard.
- 7.4 Enforcement: Subject to applicable federal, state and local law, in the event the Franchising Authority, after such meeting, determines that Grantee is in default of any provision of the Franchise, the Franchising Authority may, in addition to all other remedies it has under applicable law:
- A. Foreclose on all or any part of any security provided under this Franchise, if any, including without limitation, any bonds or other surety; provided, however, the foreclosure shall only be in such a manner and in such amount as the Franchising Authority reasonably determines is necessary to remedy the default;
  - B. Commence an action at law for monetary damages or seek other equitable relief;
- C. In the case of a substantial default of a material provision of the Franchise, or the Grantee is in bankruptcy proceedings or insolvent, declare the Franchise Agreement to be revoked; or
- D. Seek specific performance of any provision, which reasonably lends itself to such remedy, as an alternative to damages.

None of the above remedies shall be deemed exclusive.

The Grantee shall not be relieved of any of its obligations to comply promptly with any provision of the Franchise by reason of any failure of the Franchising Authority to enforce prompt compliance.

7.5 Acts of God: The Grantee shall not be held in default or noncompliance with the

provisions of the Franchise, nor suffer any enforcement or penalty relating thereto, where such noncompliance or alleged defaults are caused by strikes, acts of God, power outages or other events reasonably beyond its ability to control.

## SECTION 8 Unauthorized Reception

**8.1** Misdemeanor: It shall be a misdemeanor for any person, firm or corporation to create or make use of any unauthorized connection, whether physically, electrically, acoustically, inductively or otherwise, with any part of the Cable System without the express consent of the Grantee. Further, without the express consent of Grantee, it shall be a misdemeanor for any person to tamper with, remove or injure any property, equipment or part of the Cable System or use any unauthorized means of receiving Cable Service or other services provided thereto. Subject to applicable federal and state law, the Franchising Authority shall enforce criminal misdemeanor law which will enforce the intent of this Section 8.1. In the absence of applicable federal and state laws, the Franchising Authority shall incorporate into its criminal code, if not presently a part thereof, criminal misdemeanor law which will enforce the intent of this Section 8.1.

## SECTION 9 Miscellaneous Provisions

- **9.1** <u>Documents Incorporated and Made a Part Hereof</u>: The following documents shall be incorporated herein by this reference, and in the case of a conflict or ambiguity between or among them, the document of latest date shall govern:
  - A. Any enabling ordinance in existence as of the date hereof; and,
- B. Any proposal submitted by Grantee pursuant to a franchise renewal procedure, as amended and supplemented during the franchise renewal negotiation process;
- C. Any franchise agreement between Grantee and Franchising Authority reflecting the renewal of the Franchise, if any.
- **9.2** <u>Preemption</u>: If the FCC, or any other federal or state body or agency shall now or hereafter exercise any paramount jurisdiction over the subject matter of the Franchise, then to the extent such jurisdiction shall preempt and supersede or preclude the exercise of the like jurisdiction by the Franchising Authority, the jurisdiction of the Franchising Authority shall be superseded regarding the matter in question.
- 9.3 <u>Actions of Franchising Authority</u>: In any action by the Franchising Authority or representative thereto mandated or permitted under the terms hereof, such party shall act in a reasonable, expeditious and timely manner. Furthermore, in any instance where approval or consent is required under the terms hereof, such approval or consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

9.4 Notice: Unless expressly otherwise agreed between the parties, every notice or response to be served upon the Franchising Authority or Grantee shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given to the required party five (5) business days after having been posted in a properly sealed and correctly addressed envelope by certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, at a Post Office or branch thereof regularly maintained by the U. S. Postal Service.

The notices or responses to the Franchising Authority shall be addressed as follows:

The notices or responses to the Grantee shall be addressed as follows:

Cable & Communications Corporation P.O. Box 280 Circle, Montana 59215

Franchising Authority and the Grantee may designate such other address or addresses from time to time by giving notice to the other.

- **9.5** <u>Descriptive Headings</u>: The captions to Sections contained herein are intended solely to facilitate the reading thereof. Such captions shall not affect the meaning or interpretation of the text herein.
- **9.6** Severability: If any section, sentence, paragraph, term or provision hereof is determined to be illegal, invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction or by any state or federal regulatory authority having jurisdiction thereof, such determination shall have no effect on the validity of any other Section, sentence, paragraph, term or provision thereof, all of which will remain in full force and effect for the term of the Franchise or any renewal or renewals thereof.
