The Miles City Police Department will be accepting applications for a patrol officer vacancy. Candidates must pass the Montana Law Enforcement Testing Consortium, be at least 18 years of age and possess a valid driver's license. Qualified candidates must pass the initial interviews, criminal history, thorough background check, drug screen, physical exam, psychological exam and police commission interview.
